

Our region has a couple of important events on the racing calendar coming up this season. Of course, within the next couple of days – on May 12th and 13th – we will be conducting our double regional races, the **Joe DeLuca and Linda Gronlund Freedom Races**, at Pocono International Raceway. Named in honor of our two friends and region members who were lost on



United Flight 93, this is an event which takes a lot of planning and volunteer help to put on. I'm sure that **Darrell** has also mentioned the need for volunteer help in his column, so please come out and support our region.

In July we will be at Lime Rock for our Nationals. Then we'll be back at Lime Rock again in August for our traditional Regionals. But more on those events in the next issue. For now, please make arrangements to support the **Joe DeLuca and Linda Gronlund Freedom Races** at Pocono.

An item on one of the automobile information websites recently reported that Lamborghini sold 2087 Gallardo and Murcielago cars in various model configurations during the last calendar year and turned a pre-tax profit of about \$24 million. My calculator tells me that this is just about \$11,500 profit on each car sold. I know that Lambos are not your entry-priced vehicles — the cheapest has got to be a couple hundred thou — but that is a healthy profit none-the-less. Especially when you consider that Lamborghini is part of the Volkswagen corporate group. Heck, I can remember when 11,500 bucks could buy you around seven or eight VW beetles. Yeah, I know... I'm older than dirt.

Arthur Pearson tells me that Jodie and he went to see a Broadway show with Doris Gronlund recently. Appears that Doris has completed her five weeks of daily radiation therapy. Arthur says she "looks wonderful, feels great and shows no signs of having gone through radiation and chemo treatments for the past few weeks - nor any signs of the heart problem that developed during those treatments. She is excited about going to see her boyfriend in Norway and will be leaving on May 4 and returning on June 10 from that trip." Also along to see the show was Lorna Dallas, the lady who portrayed Linda in last year's feature film, "United 93." I am told that Doris and Lorna keep in touch and visit whenever Lorna is in the New York area.

And Jodie is also excited about having landed the role of a nun in a new movie called "Our Lady of Victory". Based on a true story, it is about a 30-something woman who after various problems in her life decides to "go for it" and becomes a top women's basketball coach. The team she coached was from a Catholic girls college near Philadelphia, hence Jodie's role. While Jodie's role will have comedic aspects, the film itself is considered a "feel good" movie. It is supposed to start filming sometime in May in and around Philadelphia, with filming lasting about six weeks.

Did you know that Buick sold more cars in China last year than they sold in the United States? True. In the early 1980s Buick was selling over one million vehicles annually here at home. But stateside sales have declined in recent years. Last year Buick's domestic sales were in the 250,000 units range. Adding in the sales in China brought total output to 567,000 units in 2006. I am trying to picture a couple hundred thousand Buicks being driven around in China by elderly oriental gents and ladies, all of them being driven so slowly that rickshaws are attempting to pass them, and most with their left turn signal constantly on. It's gotta be the oriental version of Florida.

This year's Spring **NorthEast Division Roundtable** was held in Buffalo and hosted by the **Western New York Region**. The region was celebrating their 60th anniversary. Instead of holding the Saturday banquet at the hotel, they arranged for a catered dinner at the Buffalo Transportation and Pierce-Arrow Museum across town. Both before and after dinner we were able to wander around the museum and examine the displays of old cars and driving and transportation memorabilia which the museum offers. It was very interesting and a great deal of fun.

In line with the foregoing, let me mention that **Northern New Jersey Region** will be celebrating our 60th anniversary in 2010. The region has submitted a bid to host the 2010 RoundTable here in northern NJ. We've got a "good time" reputation to uphold in hosting such an event and the region will be looking for ideas and help. Joe Russell has already begun assembling his committee to begin planning. Some used Prius hybrids in California are commanding an asking price of as much as \$4,000 over the average used price of this Toyota model. California buyers are ready and willing to cough up that amount of extra cash for a "pre-owned" Toyota which has a Clean Air Vehicle sticker affixed to the window. Why? It seems that a CAV sticker grants the driver – regardless the number of passengers in the car — instant access to the coveted commuter, or High Occupancy Vehicle, lanes where traffic often sweeps by while other drivers sit. The stickers, which read, "Access OK," were approved by lawmakers in a state increasingly worried about the twin perils of pollution and petroleum imports. California has capped the number of stickers to hybrid owners at 85,000. This has resulted in a growing market for used vehicles that already have them. Under the law the sticker stays with the car, even when the car changes ownership. If these stickers are really raising the value of a used Prius by four grand, then I've got to think that there is someone out there in La-la Land who is counterfeiting these "Access OK" stickers and selling them on the black market. At a discounted price of, say, only two grand, it'd only require selling a couple hundred of the ersatz stickers in order to afford one of the new Gallardo models from Lamborghini. Hmmmmm....

Maura Perry sent me a note suggesting I take a look at a website out of Tulsa Oklahoma. Nope, it ain't got nothin' to do with corn that's as high as an elephant's eye. It's all about a Plymouth Belvedere that's as low as it can go. Seems back in 1957 the folks out there buried a new Plymouth as a "time capsule" to be unearthed in 2007. 


