

On December 10^{th} the state legislature approved a bill which requires — under penalty of law — that motorists either change lanes or slow down when they come upon a cop or an ambulance or highway maintenance workers displaying a flashing light. Makes sense, doesn't it? But therein lies the problem. Our elected representatives are trying to legislate common sense and that has never worked. It may be a good idea to exercise caution when passing a police car, ambulance, tow truck or other emergency vehicle stopped on the shoulder of the road, but please don't make it a punishable offense if a motorist feels that his own safety is jeopardized by doing so.

The proposed law would carry a fine of from \$100 to \$500. That stinks. Heck, Governor Jon "I don't got to wear no steenkin' seat belt" Corzine was the architect behind his own well-publicized injuries in the accident caused by a double lack of common sense (speeding & no seat belt). That accident also involved an avoidance lane change and the Gov only paid a \$46 fine in court. Let's see if Governor "Sixteen Broken Bones" Corzine signs this bill into law.

Season Ends

We've made it to the end of the 2007 road rally year (even thought the last two events will be scored for 2008).

It was an interesting year and a full blown learning experience for me. We'll keep the "learning" part out of this.

The year had its ups and downs. We had 22 cars at May Daze to start the NNJR year and 45 cars at the PBX in November. That number of participants was encouraging but not reflected in some of our other events. The Mini Monte, one of the most historic rallys we run, only had 9 teams. The Teddy Bear Charity Rally managed to attract 17 teams. I believe there would have been more but I think they fell afoul of some pretty bad weather.... and some uncertainty about whether the rally would run or be rescheduled.

Before we get to the rap ups for 2007, let me mention that we are already planning our 2008 lineup.

May Daze − 05/18 Mini Monte − 08/24 PBX − 11/15 Teddy Bear − 12/07

You can expect to see at least 2 more joining the schedule next year.

The last two rallys were the PBX on 11/17 and the Teddy Bear on 12/02. Below are write-ups of each event.

2007 PBX (IX)

The last of the *major* TSD Road Rallies is now entered into history. The PBX (Pine Barrens Express) made its 9th presence in the Pine Barrens of Southern New Jersey. If you wonder why it's run in South Jersey, the reason is: The Pine Barrens are there! You don't race up or down NJ Route 17 or on the main drag of Newark. Too many people are there. So, run your rally where there aren't any houses or people. That's what we do.

Getting back to history, no club or organization has run more than 6 TSD Rallies in the Pine Barrens. The last Series (the Jersey Bounce) ended in 1990. The PBX began 8 years later. So, the PBX is the longest running event in the Barrens. Next, This is the first time in many years that almost half of the reigning National Champions Ran a Championship TSD event in New Jersey. While the next info is not a record, it shows the possibility of increased participation by sometime-rallyists. We had 45 cars, 43 which finished. That in itself is something new. Only two dropouts from a field of 45.

For that many cars running it was usually around 4 cars that DNF'd. So, things look a bit better. 25 Novices ran, 10 Stock, 5 Equipped and 2 Limited rounded out the group. Four NNJR members ran, 8

South Jersey Region ran, 2 from the following regions ran: Finger Lakes, Washington DC & Detroit. Single members from Philly (down a bit from recent years), Northeast Ohio, New York, and MSNE.

Surprisingly, none from New England this year. Another reason for lower attendance from our Regions is in past years there have been a number of retirees that have migrated down South and to the Southwest. The field of cars has changed a little, but no big surprises or new trends (yet). Down from a maximum of 14, only ten Subaru Impreza WRXs ran (plus 2 other Suby models). Down from an average of 4 was VW, with only 2 cars. Up considerably, was Jeep. There were 7 Jeeps (up from an average of 2). Three Toyotas ran (one from each division – a Yaris, a Carolla & a Tacoma plus 3 Mitsubishis. A couple of Saturns ran along with the same number of Range Rovers, Chevy trucks, Mazdas & Nissans. One of each of the following: GMC Sonoma, Audi Coupe & Honda. A few surprises though, a Lexus RX330 and Infinity FX45. No Jags, no Ferraris, no Maybachs.

Who Dunnit? The following are the top finishers. They earned every point they didn't get. For those of you who follow Rallying, these names are "old hat".

1 st Equipped & 1 st OA – Tom Bell & Jack von Kaenel in a Suby	35 points
2 nd Equipped & 2 nd OA – Jim Wakemen & Mark Haas in a Saturn	41 points
3 rd OA & 1 st Stock - Frank Bochanski & Peter Chezik in a Corolla	62 points
3 rd Equipped & 3 rd OA - Jeff Wakemen & Jim Wakemen (Jr) in a Mazda	62 points
1 st Limited & 4 th OA – Ken Hargreaves & Hugo Brunnert in a Suby	95 points
2 nd Limited & 5 th OA – Lynnette & John Mager in a Jeep	117 points
2 nd Stock & 7 th OA - Tim Bakker & Mike Bush in a Suby	153 points
1 st Novice & 8 th OA – Mark & Alex Sundt in a VW (father & teen son)	487 points

The point of interest is how well some did over others and under what circumstances.

The first 3 Overall positions are broken apart by a tie. Third Place was won by an Equipped car/team, and a Stock car & team. A computer versus pen & paper and a calculator. The 8th Overall position was won by a Novice team, again with pencil, paper and a calculator. 9th Overall was won by another Novice team with 498 points. That's just 11 points more than the previous position. My point is: it doesn't take a \$550 computer to do well in a TSD Rally. Furthermore, the previous **2 PBX Rallies were won** 1st Overall & 1st Stock by a team with only pencil, paper & a calculator. I'll see you next May for the May Daze Rally. Teddy Bear 17

The weather report was troubling early on December 2 - **snow**. There were numerous accidents on the interstates and more snow and wintry mix were forecast for later in the day. The proposed Rallye ran through hilly areas of Morris & Hunterdon Counties and the roads are rural. Pete drove those sections before 9am. The roads he reported were either plowed and salted or passable with care. It was on. We posted that news on the WEB and answered phone and e-mail messages, then headed to the Start; a new one for us, Stu Lasser's Subaru Dealer on Route 46 in Mount Olive. We hoped for a good turnout because the entry 'fee' is a stuffed animal to be given to the Marine Corps' **Toys for Tots program**. The weather limited the turnout to just 17 cars.

Peter has been Rallyemaster for the Teddy Bear Series for time out of mind except last year while he was working in Australia. Nevertheless, the same successful format has been used every year. The route is made up of 'Legs', that is sections between CHECKPOINT's at which you record your mileage. Each Leg except one used for the odometer factor correction may have route-following traps. It has always been the designed so that at the end of each Leg, everyone is back on course but with a mileage error if they fell for the trap. In the Teddy Bear Series, photos are often used to either cause the trap or bring the teams back on course.

In this Rallye, the first Leg was the OD Correction Leg and there were no traps. The only trap in the second Leg was based on a Delta Mileage. You were instructed to go 4.8 miles and make a R (right turn) immediately after a black and yellow crossroad sign. The first sign turned up in 2.4 miles and those teams who didn't check the mileage turned incorrectly and got a small mileage penalty but missed a manned passage control. There was a sign and a turn at the 4.8 mileage point. The trap in the 3rd Leg was based on an instruction calling for a L on Foxhill Rd. You encountered Fox Hill Rd. first and if you turned you came back on course with a 30 point penalty. The **General Instructions** explain that the road names must be exact.

The trap in the next Leg was based on a picture of a crossroad sign. The picture showed a sign with a ding and small trees behind it. The first crossroad sign had no ding and the background was different. The penalty was 400 points if you turned at the first sign. The Generals also explain that the Rallye is run on **through paved public roads** unless otherwise specified and because of that, the teams who were traveling on dirt at this point came upon an intersection at which the intersecting road was paved and should have turned onto pavement. The penalty: 17 points.

The picture of a hitching post should have caused the teams to go L but if missed, the route self-corrected with an error of 100 points. One picture was so easy, a photo of a Camp Bernie sign, the actual sign matched in every detail **except**, it was on the left and SOL wasn't specified - penalty: 140 points. Two more photos and two more traps based on those photos finished out the day. The total mileage was just under 75 miles.

The Rallye ended at the Teddy Bear Traditional ending spot, the Long Valley Brew Pub in the middle of Long Valley. Everyone finished and appeared to enjoy the food and beverages, as well as the camaraderie of the other Rallyeists, although there were some groans as Peter explained the traps. The placings are presented below. Our thanks to everyone.

NEW BUSINESS


The next board meeting will be held at Driving Impressions on 11/13/07.
