What's DA Matter This Month?

NNJR is full swing in the 2008 season. Solo is very active. Rally has MayDaze, and Racing starts on the traditional Mother's Day at Pocono for the Joe DeLuca and Linda Gronlund Freedom Races and Enduro. This year we are hosting the Driving Impressions Pro-IT series. NNJR is partnering with South Jersey Region to form the New Jersey Road Racing Series.

What does it take to run a region?

We are a single region for our big Club the SCCA, we are the NNJR region that encompasses the top 13 counties in New Jersey. If you look at NNJR from a business point of view where we have products and customers, our customers come from all over the SCCA as well as friends of our club.

Our region has a Board of Trustees that acts like a Board of Directors for a big company. We have 4 divisions: Race, Rally, Solo and Operations.

The operations department is in charge of the Pole Position, creating and tracking budgets, the day-to-day operations and interfacing with SCCA.

We have the best members in all the SCCA. How many members volunteer their businesses for the club to use? Reinertsen Motors Saab and G&S Autoworks volunteer the use of their facilities for Once-A-Year Tech. Driving Impressions and Evergreen Performance products volunteer their office space to use for Board meetings. The Ponderosa in West Orange volunteers their time and space for our membership meetings. Seems I use the word volunteer a lot.

The Solo division is run by Ernie Andersen and his staff. Ernie is a past RE and knows how to make Solo operate. His group of volunteers have the Solo events running like a clock; that group is flawless.

Rally is headed by Wendell Newsome. Rally is the smallest but very active division. With four (4) rallies officially sanctioned by NNJR, this division is quite busy. The Pine Barrens Express is a nationally known rally held in South Jersey in the Pinelands. Amazing what a small group of dedicated volunteers can do. Remember, the first NNJR event was a rally.

The Race division is the biggest division and most susceptible to economic turmoil. How many volunteers does it take to host a racing event? In 2006 and 2007 this division did not perform to budget. There was one event in each year that caused us grief. In 2008 the region will pursue new avenues for the Race Division with the addition of New Jersey Motorsports Park. We will be partnering with South Jersey Region to make this venue a mainstay on the SCCA racing calendar. But before we can go to NJMP, we need to host our events at Pocono and Lime Rock. We do all this with volunteers.

At Pocono on May 10 and 11 is our 3rd Annual Joe DeLuca and Linda Gronlund Freedom Races and Enduro. This is the first NJRRS race event and will also have the Driving Impressions Pro-IT. Joe and Linda are missed everyday and they are truly special to the region.

In July we are partnering with neighboring regions to assist with events at Pocono and NJMP.

In August we head to Lime Rock for our National - last year was a great event and this year will be even better. Lime Rock is repaving and we will be the first SCCA event on the new surface. We will be using the traditional course and there will also be a Driving Impressions Pro-IT race, double points. The entry will be more than last year but the cost of racing keeps increasing as well.

In late August we head south to NJMP for our first race at this world class facility. We have had several meetings with Joe Volpe and the NJMP staff. We look forward to many, many years of racing in the great Garden State. In August and September NJMP will host several pro events - look for more detail on the role of NNJR when time draws near, I'm sure our stellar worker crew will be welcome. SJR will host an event on Thunderbolt in September and then NNJR will host the Jersey Road Racing Classic in October. Expect the JRRC to be THE event of the year in the northeast.



Road Rally 2008 Begins

Spring is sprung, the grass is riz, I wonder where da boidies iz?

There isn't a lot of road rally activity, especially in the not-so-open wilds of western New Jersey during winter. When Wendell Newsome asked me to do a "light" check of his upcoming May Daze Rally and crank up route distances for the rally while out there, I couldn't say no.

First, the sun came out that Saturday morning (the 12th) and then the temperature began to rise. The next thing we knew the temperature was rattling around 72 degrees and flowers were opening everywhere. The route takes contestants around some very scenic territory and covers a good chunk of western N.J. The rally begins, as usual, at the Clinton Station Diner off Interstate 78 (exit 13). If you've never been there, the place has a railroad station motif including a model train circling one of the dining rooms, and a real railroad dining car. The dining car is the location where registration and other pertinent data is dispensed. There's been a new SCCA Rally policy adopted by the powers that be in Topeka, so SCCA members get a discount on their entry fee. The rally covers a large area close to "home base", going as far west as a stones-throw (if you had George Washington's pitching ability) to the Delaware River.

Being out West, you get to pass by many a spread of cattle, and you'll probably see a small passel of buffalo (either them or Bison – I don't know the difference). Speaking of Washington, if you go there, and if it's Granada you're seeking, it's only Asbury (no park). You get to ramble along the former Route 69 (no rest break there), and cross the crookedest bridge in New Jersey. You'll know it when you see it. I'd recommend you slow down as you cross, not to see scenery, but to avoid having your car drive the next mile crookedly. You'll get a nice rest break at the third reservoir after passing two others. And, to note a final New Jersey oddity, you get to drive pass a port that is some 50 miles from the nearest freighter or cruise ship-mooring place.

The Rally finishes where it started (so if you left your car at the start, you won't have to hitch a ride to get back to your car). Lotsa trophies, good food and friendly chatter await you at the diner. I'll be there, so you can talk to me about the Rally.

While I have the opportunity, I would like to take the time to let you know that one of NJJR's hard working ex-members passed away in early February. She retired from the SCCA some years ago. Recently, she had been working Registration at the annual PBX Rally the past 6 years. I'm speaking of a hard-working Safety Steward at the SCCA tracks back in the 70's & 80's. Old-timers will Remember Kathleen (Kay) Hennessey. She had been fighting cancer for the past few years. This last November she had a little time between chemo sessions, so she came out and worked the PBX Rally registration with my wife.

That sad notice fits into a request to our members. Kay's passing leaves a hole in our organization. Putting on rallies takes time and personnel. The North Jersey Region has a problem with a lack of personnel putting these events on. We have a good, local core of helpers that come out to work each event, but there aren't enough of them.

Because rallying isn't all the rage, not too many people want to get involved. We've lost many of our key personnel over the past 4 years because they were part of the group who picked-up on the sport in the mid-fifties and sixties. Most are retired and are moving away. Then there are those who have passed away. Others just don't have the time or interest anymore. That leaves us with a big shortage. Everyone gets tired of doing the work of two or more people who have left. We are now reaching the point, that if we don't get some more assistance, then this activity will just cease. We need some new blood, people to help handle the nuts & bolts end of the sport. We'll talk and see if you can help.

At any rate, we hope to see you on the 17th of May (which is also Armed Forces Day).

Joe DeLuca and Linda Gronlund Freedom Races and Enduro

Our region lost two of our most active members in the terrorist actions on September 11th. Linda Gronlund and Joseph DeLuca were traveling to San Francisco on United Airlines flight 93 when it was hijacked and subsequently crashed in Somerset County, Pennsylvania, killing all on board.

Linda was our region's Flag Marshal. She had joined the Sports Car Club of America in June of 1980 while living in Sag Harbor, New York. She quickly became active in SCCA activities at the Bridgehampton Road Race Circuit near her hometown and at other tracks all over the northeast. Linda earned a law degree and worked for several automotive companies over the years. She was on a business trip to the west coast for her employer, BMW North America, when she was killed. Linda and Joe planned to travel and sightsee in northern California after Linda's business purpose had been accomplished.

Joe DeLuca joined our club in January, 1980. He was most recently our region's Board Secretary.



Previously, and at various times over the years, Joe had been a Trustee, Assistant Regional Executive, Regional Executive, and newsletter editor. Initially a rallyist, Joe later was also an active participant in Solo II and road racing. He enjoyed driving his Morgan and was the current president of the local Morgan club in New Jersey. Joe was the creator of "The Adventures of Raymond the Cat," a monthly cartoon feature in the Northern New Jersey Region's newsletter, "Pole Position." The cartoon is syndicated in many regional publications across the nation. Joe's cartooning was a spotlighted article in the July 2001 issue of SCCA's national publication, "SportsCar." Joe was on vacation from Pfizer Corporation where he was a systems analyst.

Active members in SCCA know what these two wonderful individuals knew: SCCA membership brings a friendship, a camaraderie, which borders on being family. The Northern New Jersey Region has lost two very special members of our family. The entire SCCA organization feels this loss.






