Finally the warmer weather has arrived. Hooray for that! Of course by the time you're reading this, we will have hopefully had bunches of nice days. But as I sit here writing, it is one of those uniquely nice, warm early spring days. And after our very snowy winter, there are lots of potholes out there lurking in wait for unsuspecting drivers.

A bunch of students in Milan, Italy have come up with an idea for what is being referred to as "Designer Potholes." Their plan is to start at the road construction stage and make the lower layer of road asphalt a bright color such as yellow or orange, so that when the surface breaks, the potholes

will be easily spotted wounds in the road surface. In response a student in Britain has suggested another possibility: plant flowers in the potholes so that drivers would try to avoid them. Well, the big news heading into the previous issue of the old *pole cat* was our then-upcoming hosting of the NE-Division's **2010 Spring RoundTable** at the Hamilton Park Hotel & Convention Center in Florham Park. Congrats to all the key players, but especially to our First Lady and Convention Chair Extraordinaire, Linda Santangelo-Mosley!

Hamilton Park is ideally suited to holding a gathering such as ours. They are geared to staging business meetings and training sessions. It's their *forté*; it's what they do five days a week. And that's a key also, since they are usually not fully booked on weekends. The staff was delighted to have us there on a weekend, which is usually the slow part of the week for them. We pretty much had the run of the place – and we certainly had the staff tripping over themselves to satisfy our needs!

The party on Saturday evening was great! Linda had decided it should have a "Gilligan's Island Beach Party" theme. Linda's hubby, **Regional Exec Chris Mosley**, brought his DJ equipment and supplied the music for the evening's entertainment. Jeff Dahnert, SCCA's Prez & CEO, was in from Topeka and attended the party. Jeff took the microphone to make a few comments and said that he has been doing the circuit of the Divisional Conferences around the country recently. He had heard about our region having a strong reputation as a party region. Jeff said that without a doubt we had once again set the bar higher than he'd been told from previous party attendees.

We recognized the **NNJR Solo Series** class champions for the season just past – they were all listed in the March-April issue of the *pole cat*. The **Chiefs of** the various **Specialties** on the road racing side of our club were recognized as well as the **Workers of the Year** in each specialty.

Because of the nature of the standard business purpose of this facility, the pricing of the overall event – room cost vs meals only cost vs convention seminars cost vs party only cost – was a bit confusing. More than a couple of times someone would ask me, "Is this really included?" All the meals were included – and they were sumptuous. Breakfast: Anything you want...eggs, bacon several kinds of sausages, bagels, lox — I mean, if someone normally has a particular dish for breakfast, you could get it. Lunch was a buffet — hot, cold, whatever, everything. Total dessert table at lunch — all kinds, plus a 5 gallon bucket of ice cream — scoop out however much you wanted.

The dinner at our Saturday night party was again a buffet — or should I say several buffets! One table had Chinese food. Further along you could get Mexican. Another buffet table set up along the opposite wall had Italian. And the fourth buffet table... well, I don't know what was on that table — I never got that far! Entrée items were available for over two hours — keep on eating. After that they switched two of the tables over to desserts — I think they call it a Viennese Table — Holy crap! I think I'm still on a sugar high!

And we also awarded a well-deserved and long overdue **Giltzow Award** to our immediately past Regional Executive, **Darrell T. Anthony**! The Giltzow is named for former member Bill Giltzow and is given to a member who has exemplified Bill's dedication and service to our region. DA guided our region through a difficult economic period successfully and was a key reason why the **Northern New Jersey Region** was awarded the **Regional Achievement Award** for large regions at the **National Convention** in Las Vegas last January. Our Region will only have one race at Lime Rock this year – we will be sharing responsibility for the May 14-15 National Races there along with Mohawk-Hudson Region. There are one or two other SCCA dates at Lime Rock but our name isn't on them. SCCA Pro has some dates on Lime Rock's calendar and I'm thinking that Nancy & I may try to volunteer at a couple of them.

That's because Nancy & I happen to enjoy live theater and there's the barn theater just down the road a couple of miles from the track, the **TriArts Theater in Sharon**. Two Pro dates will coincide with productions at TriArts. A **Trans-Am** race on July 2 & 3

coincides with the run of "*The Wedding Singer*." Also, one of the weekends during the run of a play called "*The 25th Annual Putnam County Spelling Bee*" (I never heard of this one either) will mesh with another Pro SCCA race, a **Formula 2000** double event. The third 2010 TriArts production – "Oklahoma" in mid-August – won't coincide with any SCCA event at the track. Too bad. TriArts presents really good theatrical productions. If you haven't gone to one of their shows – they do three productions every summer – you've missed some good theater.

This year's **One Lap of America** will probably still be running when you receive this issue in the mail. The **One Lap** is an eightday event running from April 30th through May 8th at various tracks around the country. And there are two entries running in this year's event which I wish to spotlight. A new member of our region, **Laura Risi**, is competing in the One Lap with her step-Dad, **Greg**. They are raising awareness of – and accepting donations for — an organization called **Rainbows** which helps kids through loss crises such as the death of a parent or similar life-altering situations. For as many years as I can remember, Fay and Dave, running as the **Laps to Conquer MS** team, have been doing the One Lap and raising money for **Multiple Sclerosis** research. The Teals are members of **South Jersey Region**. Best of luck to both teams. Here's hoping you take the top two positions in the finishing order!

As I was leaving the track at NJMP after our Drivers School at the end of March, I saw a sign on the wall of a restaurant on the corner of High and Main Streets in the heart of Millville proclaiming that this place was "The Best Sushi Bar in Millville." But I have to wonder: *How many sushi bars are there in Millville*? Might it be just as accurate to say that it was also "The Worst Sushi Bar in Millville?"

Speaking of the **Drivers School & PDX** on Lightning in March, I was chatting with **Butch O'Connor** and a couple other folks at the end of day beer party and was sipping on a bottle of Shiner Bock, the beer which has become associated with me. Shiner Bock is brewed in Texas and is not available in New Jersey. I travel a couple hundred miles to pick up a couple of cases every now and again. Two folks I had not met previously come over to me and the lady asks, "Where did you get the Shiner Bock? I'm from Texas and I can't get it anywhere around here."

Melissa and Brandon Fetch had moved to northern New Jersey a while back and joined our Northern New Jersey Region. Brandon was attending the Drivers School and Melissa was crewing for him. As we continue chatting, I ask where they now live in the north Jersey area and they tell me "in Fort Lee." Well I grew up in Fort Lee, so I ask where exactly. I guess I was expecting to hear that they have an apartment in one of the high rises which overlook the Hudson River. But no – they tell me they live on Jones Road. This is the residential street where I lived as a kid. Turns out Melissa and Brandon own the home next door to where I was born. It is certainly a small world – but I had to drive 150 miles to south Jersey and be drinking a Shiner Bock, a brand which is not available in the northeast, in order to have it proven to me!

Jeff Haines lost his brother recently. Alan Haines passed away suddenly on March 16. Alan and his family lived in Monroeville, NJ, just a few miles north of NJMP. The region's condolences go out to Jeff and **Pam, Tim & Phillip** and all the members of the Haines family.

Some months ago, the *Connellsville Daily Courier* in western Pennsylvania reported that the Fayette County 911 had received calls of a tiger on the loose in North Union. Investigation showed that none of the tigers had escaped from a Wild Animal Orphanage in the area nor was any big cat missing from Camelot Veterinary Clinic. All their big cats were accounted for. Eventually the ferocious feline was found and captured. They found it to be considerably smaller – it was a domestic tabby. *Whew! Ya can't be too careful!*

A couple years back, the good citizens of Christianfield, Denmark — libertarians to the core — decided to remove all of the traffic signs and signals, including the Denmark equivalent of "Don't Walk" signs, from their most dangerous intersection in order to determine if they would be safer without government intervention, which is what traffic signs unquestionably represent. "What if," these citizens asked themselves, "it was up to us, not Denmark's transportation department, to determine the safest way of crossing an intersection?" After several months of forgoing government traffic signs and depending on their own judgment — including approaching the intersection cautiously -- the number of serious accidents dropped to zero.

In early April some 150 workers at Northrop-Grumman's shipyards in Louisiana and Mississippi were laid off. However, N-G says this is a normal part of a cyclical business and should not affect the time-table for the completion of the **Somerset (LPD 25)**, which is named after the county in Pennsylvania where **Flight 93** went down. The Somerset will join the Navy in 2012 when she is commissioned.

In an item somewhat related to the Somerset, the **USS Ashland (LSD 48)** was fired upon by Somali pirates on April 10 while on the high seas about 330 nautical miles off Africa. Ashland returned fire and blew the pirate skiff out of the water. Unfortunately, the pirates had already abandoned their ship and the Ashland took them aboard. Ashland is a "dock landing ship" and although technically a different class ship from Somerset, she is similar in design and function to the LPD class – amphibious landing dock – in her role and function in the US Navy's arsenal. And an additional little tidbit of fact: Ashland was also built at the Avondale shipyards in Louisiana where Somerset is being constructed. So a similar US flagged ship coming out of the same shipyard has already taken on some terrorists – although, unfortunately, not of the same caliber or ilk as I would prefer.

The New York Times of April second had an article about 20 year old **Chase Mattioli**, the grandson of **Rose & Joseph 'Doc' Mattioli**, who own and operate *Pocono International Raceway*. Seems young Chase, a student at Fordham University, is going to be driving in some twenty ARCA events this year. He has hopes of becoming a full-time driver in NASCAR. Chase got his start in the fringes of the racing game when, at the age of five, Grandpa 'Doc' paid him to pick up cigarette butts from under the grandstands at Pocono.

When the current semester ends, Mattioli will be racing almost every weekend. And July 31 should be an interesting day, because he plans to drive in an ARCA race and a truck race at Pocono, where it all started 15 years ago. He started racing when he was 7 at the quarter-midget track just outside Turn 3 at Pocono. One ride led to another — Formula Fords, GT Mustangs, dirt modifieds. He's raced regularly at South Boston Speedway in Virginia, which is owned by his family.

Todd & Suzie Walrich have revamped their Wolf Creek Racing website where one can see the latest in Datsun 510 parts (how's that for juxtaposing a pair of opposing terms? – *latest & Datsun*!), Mikuni Carburetors & intake parts, as well as the cold, hard facts about CryoTechnology. Head for <u>www.wolfcreekracing.com</u> and enjoy a fun site. But don't leave the site until you've read some of Suzie's treatises on her "Estrogen Page."

I'm hearing that **Jerry Lustig** may be competing in the Trans-Am event at NJMP on the Thunderbolt Track over the May 7, 8, 9 weekend. It should be a good, exciting, fun weekend. I hope we will have a good showing of our NNJR volunteers to support the race. In the past, except for our most devoted volunteers, our gang has typically supported events at Lime Rock and points north more than they have supported the tracks to our south. But now that NJMP is open, I would hope that we refocus and that more folks volunteer more frequently at NJMP and cheer for Jerry in the Trans-Am!

And our Region is also going to be back at NJMP over the weekend of June 18 & 19 for a new event in our playbook. "**The Devil in the Dark**" is a Twelve Hour Endurance Race being run from noon until midnight on the **Thunderbolt Course**. This may be the first time the NNJR name has been on a twelve hour race. This is gonna be a good one – one that is gonna be repeated year after year for many years to come. You're gonna want to be there for this first one so that you can say that you were there from the beginning!

Last item today.... I don't know how many members of the Region or other readers of our *pole position* Regional newsletter have businesses which hire LTL or over-the-road trucking services, or for that matter how many members/readers are in positions where they decide or influence the selection of a trucking company for their company's business, but next month I expect to have some paragraphs and photos which will encourage that a particular trucking company be high on your list of considered trucking transporters. 




